Other reds

Consider paste tomatoes for salads and salsas, not just for cooking. They have a sweet, intense flavor and won't make your salad or salsa too drippy with juice.

Early or for cool, foggy climates

Patio tomatoes

These varieties are all determinates (short, 2-3') or semi-determinates (about 4-5'), so are easier to manage for containers, though caging or staking is still usually recommended. Note that full-size tomatoes can also be successfully grown in containers; they simply require taller cages or trellising.
